Multiple system atrophy. This uncommon, progressive neurological disorder affects many brain systems. Multiple system atrophy causes a movement disorder, such as ataxia or parkinsonism. It can also cause low blood pressure and impaired bladder function. Myoclonus. This condition causes lightning-quick jerks of a muscle or a group of muscles.

Movement System Impairment (MSI) Syndromes • Named for movement direction that causes symptoms and that is impaired. • Correction of the movement usually decreases the symptoms.

### Movement System Impairment Syndromes of the Shoulder

A majority of spinal dysfunction is the result of cumulative microtrauma caused by impairments in alignment, in stabilization, and in movement patterns of the spine. In the properly functioning spine, the balanced isometric support and control provided by the trunk muscles prevent these impairments.

### Movement Impairment Syndromes of the Lumbar Spine ...

Movement is the action of an entire system and its component parts; these include muscular, skeletal, neurologic, cardiovascular, pulmonary, and metabolic components. They are all involved in movement impairment syndromes. Repeated Movements and Prolonged Postures

### Classification Of Low Back Pain Using Shirley Sahrmann's ...

Two types of syndromes are discussed in this chapter. The first type is believed to arise from pain directly related to the hip joint. It is usually characterized by a movement impairment of an accessory motion of the femur. Thus these syndromes are identified by the name, femoral, and the offending accessory motion.
