One of the biggest errors students make in classroom presentations is placing their entire speech on the PowerPoint templates. The presentation is intended to escort your oral presentation. Show your skills orally, and holds the audience attention using inspiring quotes and messages. Insert short notes and bullet points on slides.

Each PowerPoint theme includes a pair of fonts—one for headings and titles, and another for bullet points and paragraph text. Including more than one font is key to making your slides look well-designed. However, many of the default font pairs are a little bland. Why not use some different fonts?

Creating Accessible PowerPoint Presentations for Students ...

There is a rule that can help you make a perfect presentation – the 10/20/30 rule recommends you to include not more than 10 slides in your project, limit the time of presentation to a maximum of 20 minutes, and use minimum 30-point font size to make it easy to read. You won't make a mistake if you follow this rule!

How To Make A Good PowerPoint Presentation For College ...

Well in advance of your presentation, check the room where it will be presented to make sure that it has everything you will need. Meet with the moderator and other presenters at least 10 minutes before the session. Arrange for someone to distribute your handouts. Sit with other presenters near the front.

Guidelines for Oral Presentations - Cornell College

Consider the following items when providing students your expectations for the presentation: □ There are between 10 and 20 slides AND the script for each slide is in the notes area of PowerPoint. □ The student is the star, not PowerPoint. (PowerPoint does not overpower the script in the notes area.) □ Text and images work together

Assignment: PowerPoint Presentation

Poster size must be no larger than 48" wide x 36" tall. Posters exceeding the specified dimensions may not be able to be displayed. Font and type size should be large enough to read from a 2 foot distance. A minimum of 16 point font size is required; 24 point font size is recommended.

Avoid the temptation to dress up your pages with cheesy effects and focus instead on simple design basics: Use a sans serif font for body text. Sans serifs like Arial, Helvetica, or Calibri tend to be the easiest to read on screens. Use decorative fonts only for slide headers, and then only if they're easy to read.
